



Reading & Drawing

Best for grades PreK-1st (30 minutes). Suitable for small groups and large assemblies.

In this short presentation (perfect for wiggly listeners with short attention spans) Shanda will read *DOLL-E 1.0* aloud and teach students to draw a character from the story.

Rad Robots

Best for grades K-5th (45 minutes). Suitable for small groups and large assemblies.

This fun STEM/STEAM presentation highlights fiction *and* non-fiction robots that Shanda researched as she wrote and illustrated her award-winning, STEM-friendly picture book, *DOLL-E 1.0*, which she will read aloud. Then, Shanda will demonstrate how to draw the robot from the story and answer questions.

Be a BIG ~~BAD~~ RAD Editor

Best for grades 1st-5th (45 minutes). Suitable for small groups and large assemblies.

Students will see how Shanda edited the cover of *Little Red and the Big Bad Editor*, from the first sketch to final color (including one giant, embarrassing mistake)! Then, Shanda will read the story aloud, talk about “FEEDback sandwiches,” and finish up with a pencil character drawing activity and Q&A.

Words + Illustration = Magic

Best for grades 3rd-5th (45 minutes). Suitable for small groups and large assemblies.

In this program, Shanda talks about how she *finally* found joy in reading once she discovered how words and pictures “magically” tell stories together in picture books (like *DOLL-E 1.0*) and graphic novels. Throughout the presentation, students will draw along with Shanda to complete a final “magic” example, then Q&A at the end.

Rube Goldberg Machines

Best for grades 3rd-5th (45 minutes). Suitable for small groups and large assemblies.

Featuring Shanda’s non-fiction picture book, *SMASH, CRASH, TOPPLE, ROLL!*, this program highlights Rube Goldberg’s dilemma with modern technology of the time, his wacky machine cartoons, and the vast reach of Rube’s inspiration (with the help of the six simple machines). The presentation wraps up with a machine-drawing challenge and Q&A.

Cheesy Comics - A Hands-On Writing & Illustrating Workshop!

Best for grades 3rd-5th (45 minutes - 1 hour). Suitable for groups of 60 or fewer students.

What’s better than reading comics? Making them! Shanda will share why this art form “melts” her, and then walk students through the process of creating a “cheesy” character and a 4-panel story comic of their own. **Add on this fun workshop to a full day of assemblies for just \$300!**

Tips for an Incredible Visit!

For in-person presentations, I will need:

- A board/projector/screen with sound and HDMI input so I can use my own computer. (I'll bring my presentations on a USB drive as a backup option.)
- A sturdy easel (if you have one handy)
- Microphone for large groups/spaces (I trust your judgment if this is needed)
- Clipboard, paper, and a pencil for each student to follow along during the drawing demo (optional). *Saves time if students have supplies in hand before the presentation begins. If you feel it is too cumbersome for each student to have paper/pencil, I will choose a volunteer to draw with me at the easel in front of their peers instead. You choose. Both ways are fun!*

For virtual presentations, I will need:

- Any virtual meeting platform (such as Zoom or Teams) hosted by the school
- Someone to monitor the students and questions during the meeting
- Paper and pencil for each student so they can follow along during the drawing demo



2 Tips to Make the Most of Our Visit:

- 1. Prepare the kids (and teachers).** There's nothing better than speaking to a group of students and staff who are excited I'm there! Students will be more engaged and will ask great questions if they know a bit about me and my books BEFORE the event day. My website, ShandaMc.com, is a great place to start! There are writing and drawing activities there for fun and FREE!
- 2. Participate in a book pre-sale and stock the library with my books.** This is not a requirement, but it definitely inspires when students can read (or own a signed copy of) a book by a real author and illustrator they met at their school!
